The Surfrider Foundation is a non-profit grassroots organization dedicated to the protection and enjoyment of our world's ocean, waves and beaches.





To protect water quality in local waterways and reduce ocean pollution so it is safe to surf, swim and play in the ocean.






BLUE WATER TASK FORCE

Surfrider's volunteer water testing program.

Operating through a national network of 45+ labs, BWTF citizen scientists are providing critical water quality information to protect public health at the beach, raise awareness of local pollution problems and to bring together communities to implement solutions.



Blue Water Task Force

- Test ocean & bay beaches and freshwater sources
 - Creek & river mouths
 - Stormwater discharge
 - Upper watershed sites
- Measure Enterococcus Bacteria – indicator of fecal pollution and public health risk
 - IDEXX Enterolert Quanti-Tray methodology
- Sites tested fill in data gaps of agency-run programs, cover popular surf spots, off-season months, & sources of pollution

Developing Relationships & Local Partners for Program Implementation


- Chapter maintained labs often using borrowed space from local partners - other local env groups, aquariums, universities




Post-Maria Water Sampling Program

- Days, weeks & months after Hurricane Maria: electricity, potable water, communications and travel were challenging.
- Rincon BWTF has established a strong reputation & many community partners over last decade.
- 1 month post-storm, BWTF lab re-located to Costa Salud Health Center with generator powered electricity & testing resumed.



RBC Relief Center

- Shipment center to receive water testing supplies
- Community bulletin board for communication
- Source of volunteers & transportation into hard-to-reach inland areas




Weekly sampling of beaches resumed, conditions mostly good.
