# Waltz Across Texas: Continuous Monitoring in the Lone Star State

The first Continuous Water Quality Monitoring Network (CWQMN) stations were established in Texas after a 2001 legislative directive to monitor water quality downstream of dairy Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs) in North Central Texas. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has since deployed 105 CWQMN stations, with 42 currently active, to address various data needs including interstate surface water allocations, Total Maximum Daily Loads, stream segment delineation, as well as other water resource management needs. This presentation provides a look at how we collect and use data from the network.
